

Exercise Your Right To Vote.

All Americans have the right to vote, including people with developmental disabilities.

Qualifications to Register to Vote:

- be a United States citizen:
- be 18 years old by December 31 of the year in which you file this form (note: you must be 18 years old by the date of the general, primary or other election in which you want to vote);
- live at your present address at least 30 days before an election;
- not be in prison or on parole for a felony conviction and;
- not claim the right to vote elsewhere.

Deadline to Register to Vote in a Local, State or Federal general election is:



How and Where to Register:

You have many options when it comes to registering to vote.

- In person at your county board of elections.
- In person at any New York State Agency-Based voter registration center.
- You can have a New York State Voter Registration Form mailed to you. Go to <u>www.elections.ny.gov/VotingRegister.html</u> and enter your name directly into the mailing list database to request a Voter Registration Form.
- Call 1-800-FOR-VOTE hotline to request a voter application.
- Download a PDF version of the New York State Voter Registration Form electronically at <u>www.elections.ny.gov/VotingRegister.html</u> Print the form, complete and sign it, and mail it to your county board of elections.

Agency-Based Voter Registration Program

Residents also have the opportunity to register to vote at a wide variety of other New York State agencies. This component of the National Voter Registration Act is called the "Agency-Based Voter Registration Program", and it provides registration opportunities when applying for services or assistance at state agencies.
