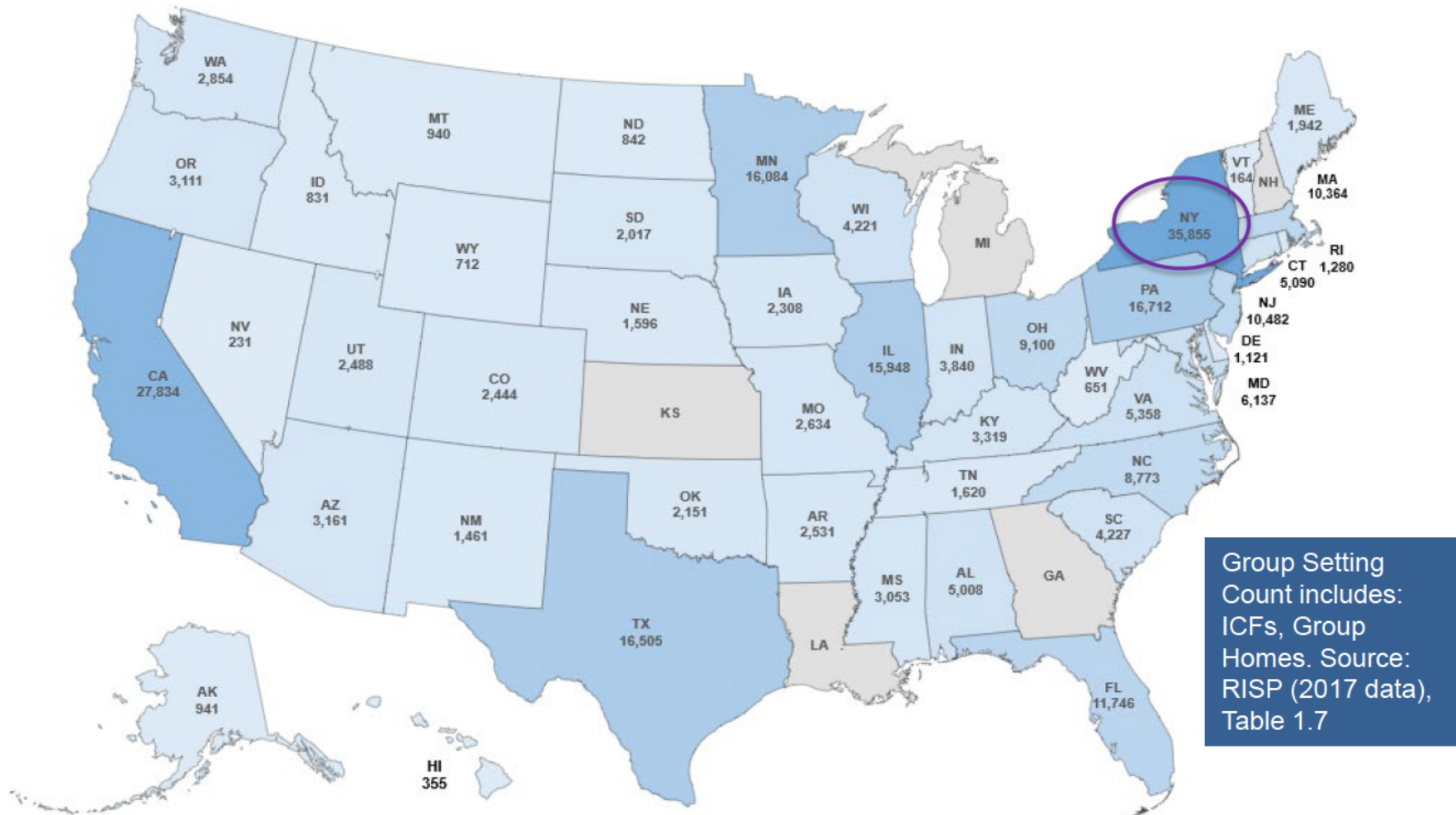

Certified Housing System by State

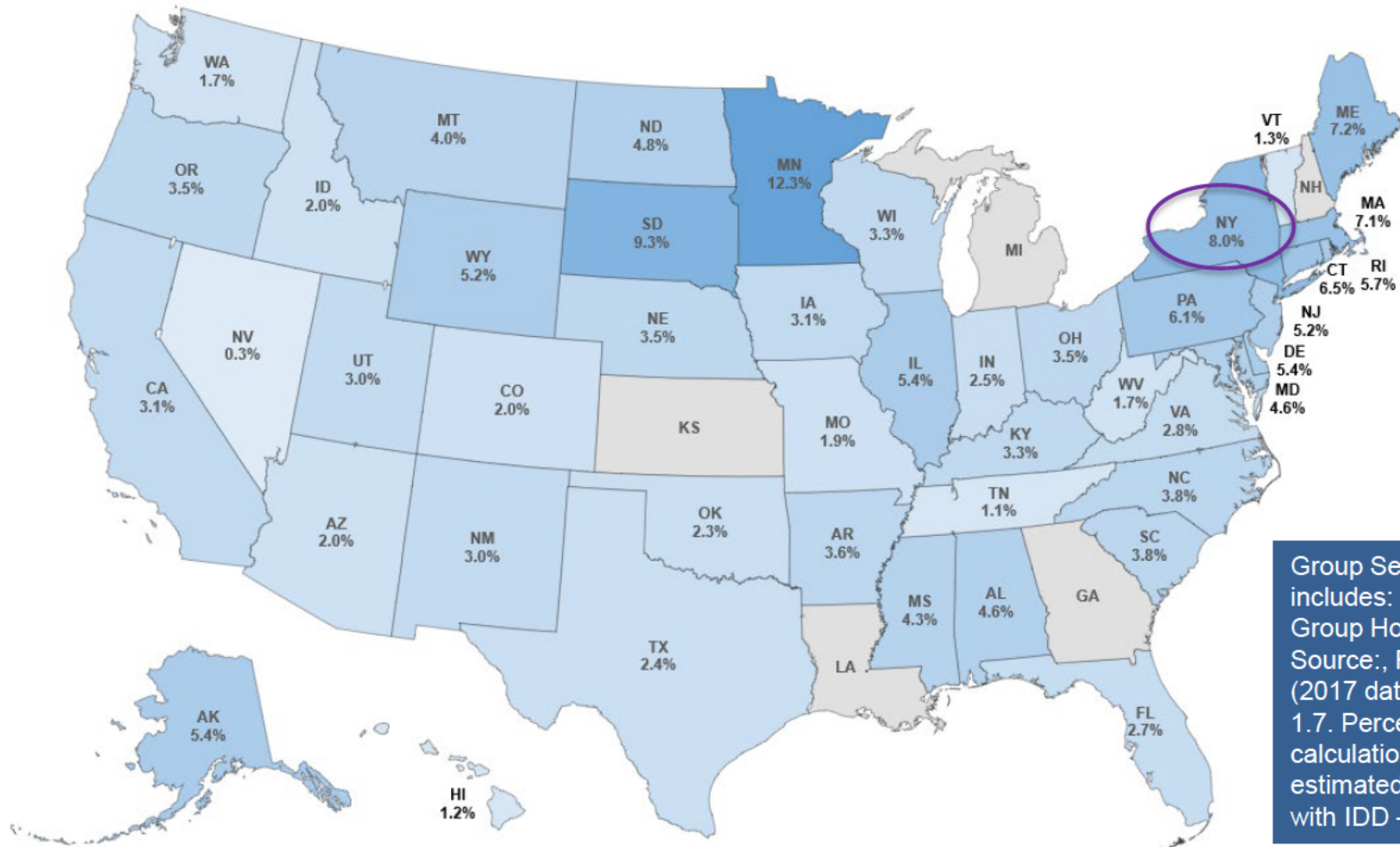

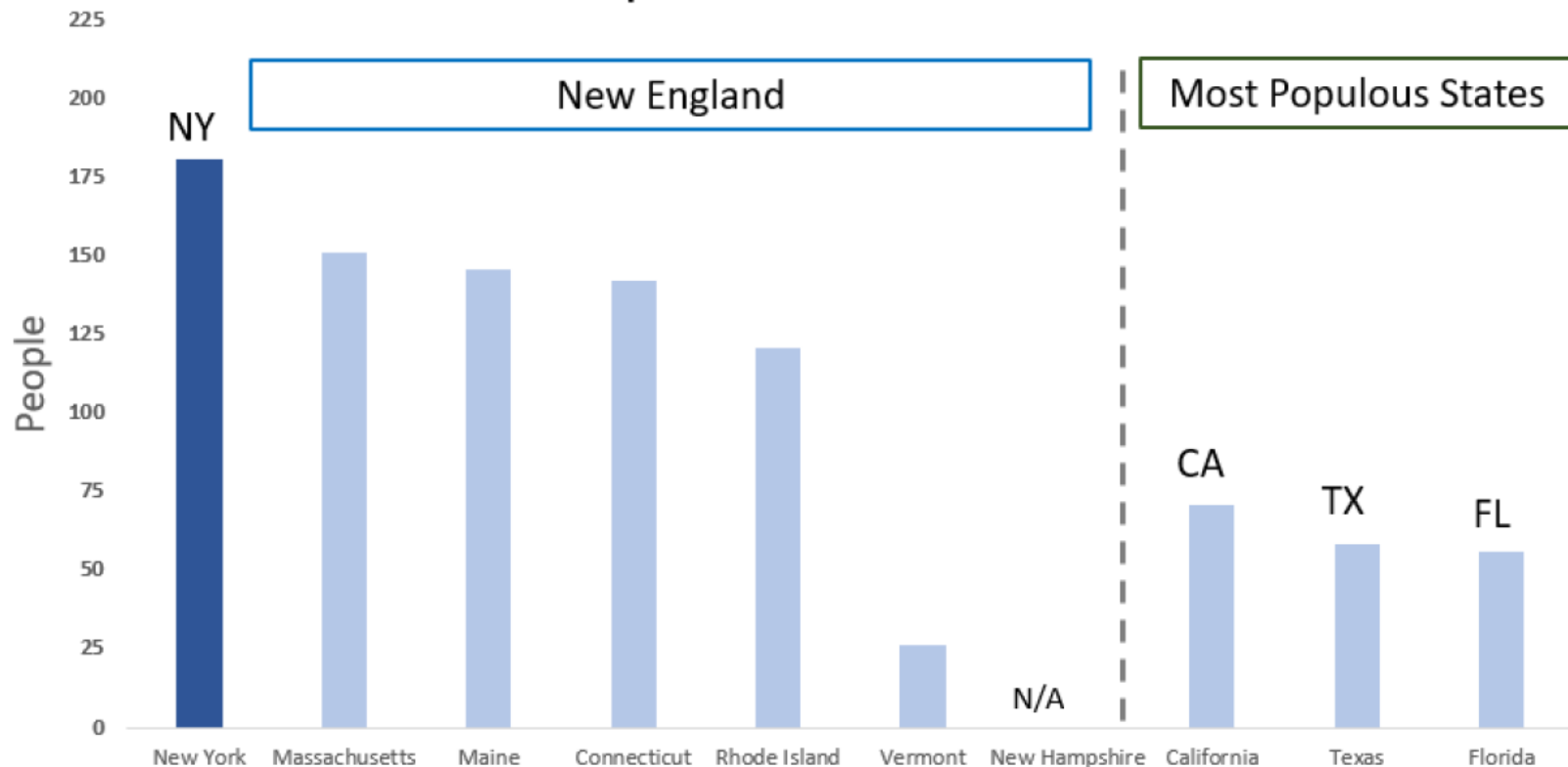

NY Compared to Other Selected States

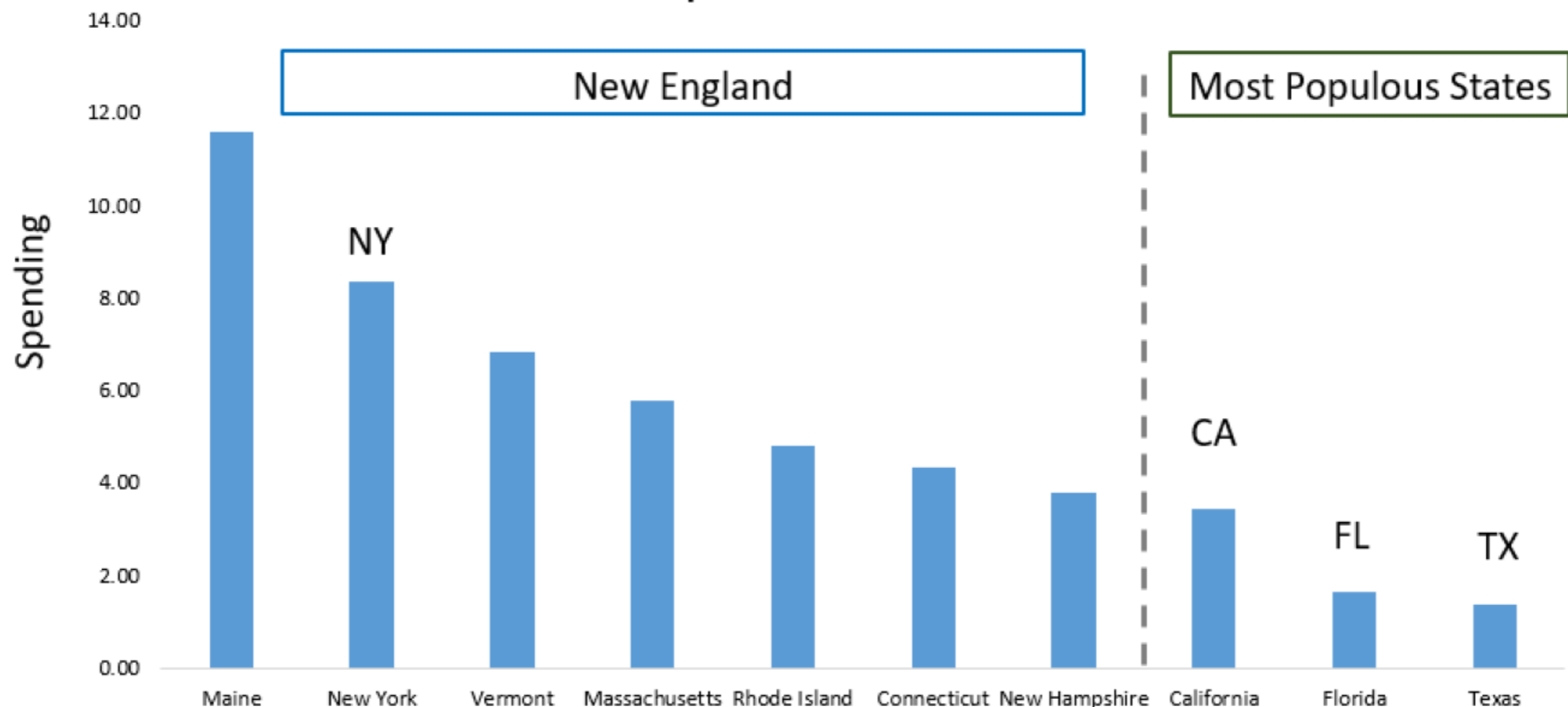
